

Spring Storm Water Update:

Please remember as you go about your spring property maintenance to properly dispose of any leaves, tree branches, trash or debris, cleaning/painting supplies, or any other liquids, other than storm water. Never place these items in the storm sewers, inlet structures, basins, creeks or drainage ways within the City. Doing this violates City Ordinance. Spring is also a great time of the year to add a rain barrel, rain garden or to do some additional landscaping and plantings on your property. The City will be actively inspecting the detention / retention wet or basins within our borders. Commercial and Residential basins will be checked for functionality, clean concrete swales, and vegetation height within and on the surrounding common ground areas. These areas are to be maintained as approved on the site/construction plans for each entity and City Code. Citations may be issued for failure to maintain basins per the approved plans and City requirements. As always, if you see any suspicious dumping of any liquids or debris into the storm sewers, drainage ways or waterways within the City of Weldon Spring, please report/ contact: Frank Godwin Storm Water Manager & Interim City Planner

The City of Weldon Spring is now accepting ball field reservations on a first-come, first-serve basis. Please come in and sign-

up for the day-of-week, time and large or small field preference. Reservation fees this year are \$12.00 per week for residents (must have proof of residency) and \$25.00 per week for non-residents. You may sign up for as many weeks as your team needs. Our ball fields are closed on holidays (i.e. Memorial Day) for private park reservations. Any team scheduled on a holiday will be able to schedule an extra week at the end of their weekly playing schedule

Sign-ups are for all children up to age 12. Coaches are invited to fill out the proper paperwork, which can be found online at www.weldonspring.org or you may pick one up at City Hall. When turning in your paperwork you will also need cash or check in the amount of the number of weeks times the cost of reservation (Residents: \$12/week; Non-Residents: \$25/week). Proof of residency is required by providing a copy of your Photo I.D. and a recent utility bill.

Veterans Tribute Park

New St. Charles County park named to honor Military who served our country.

The St. Charles County Council unanimously approved the name Veterans Tribute Park for the new park currently under construction between Pitman Hill and Kisker roads. The name was recommended to the Council by a committee created to find an appropriate way to honor service men and women from St. Charles County who have been killed

The committee was formed after several residents spoke to the Council last year, suggesting that the park be named to honor all or certain members of the military. The County Council, as well as County Executive Steve Ehlmann, agreed that they would like to see these heroes honored properly.

Veterans Tribute Park is 120 acres surrounded by residential development. The land is being developed into a new park with amenities for residents of all abilities and expected to open later this
