

She told me, 'Don, just remember, they aren't making any more land, so you don't have to accept the first proposal a developer gives the City.' Those words of wisdom stuck with me and still ring true today. Let us pause and mourn the life of one of the truly dedicated and instrumental women that helped shape Weldon Spring into the thriving and upscale community that it is today. You will be missed, Mrs. Moore...

Many new changes are on the horizon for the City as well. Our City Clerk, Melinda "Moe" Kwiatkowski, will be fully retiring after 19 years of service. We are sad to see her go as she has provided a wealth of knowledge and experience to the community and has helped many residents, businesses and elected officials navigate the local government waters over her long tenure with the City. We will be announcing her replacement in the months to come. Additionally, the City will



be searching to fill a new full-time position which will focus on community engagement and improving communications with the public. Look for this and other job postings and announcements on the City's website soon.

ORDINANCES RECENTLY APPROVED BY YOUR ALDERMEN

Below is a list of related ordinances that the Board of Aldermen passed since the last Newsletter. If you would like additional information on any of the ordinances, please feel free to contact our City Clerk at (636) 441-2110 - Ext. 103 or cityclerk@weldonspring.org.

18-04 – An Ordinance amending the Municipal Code by Repealing Section 600.500 (Number of Liquor Licenses Which May be Authorized or Issued) in its Entirety and Matters Relating Thereto.

18-05 – An Ordinance vacating certain portions of a sidewalk within the Camelot Subdivision.

18-06 – An Ordinance Providing for the Approval of the Final Record Plat for the Enclaves at Blue Ridge Terrace.

18-07 – An Ordinance Adopting the Budget for the Fiscal Year 2019 and Matters Relating Thereto.

18-08 – An Ordinance Declaring the Results of an Election Held on Tuesday, August 7th, 2018 for the Purpose of Imposing a Local Use Tax at the Same Rate as the Local Sales Tax Rate of the City for Purchases from Out-Of-State Vendors that Exceed a Total of Two Thousand Dollars in a Year. 642 YES votes – 1096 NO votes

18-09 – An Ordinance Providing for the Adoption and Enforcement of Certain Codes in order to Provide for the Public Safety and Welfare.

City of Weldon Spring - Notice of Candidate Filing Municipal Election April 2, 2019

Candidate filing may be done Monday through Friday at City Hall during normal office hours, other than on the Opening and Closing Dates. Normal City Hall office hours are 9:00 AM until 4:00 PM. Opening Date for Candidacy Filing is 8:00 AM on 12/11/18 for that day only. Closing Date for Candidacy Filing is 5:00 PM on 01/15/19 for that day only. There are no filing fees at this time.

There will be three Aldermen, one (1) from each ward elected at the Municipal Election on April 2, 2019. All positions are two (2) year terms.

Qualifications for Alderman are as follows: No person shall be an Alderman unless he or she is at least 18 years of age; a citizen of the United States, and an inhabitant and resident of the City for one year next preceding his or her election, and a resident, at the time he or she files and during the time he or she serves, of the ward from which he or she is elected.

The position for Mayor is also up for the Municipal Election on April 2, 2019. This is a two (2) year term as well.

Qualifications for Mayor are as follows: No person shall be Mayor unless he/she be at least 25 years of age, a citizen of the United States, and an inhabitant and resident of the City at the time of and for at least one (1) year next preceding his/her election.

Veterans Tribute Park opens to the public.

St. Charles County celebrated and introduced their newest addition to the ever-expanding County Parks system with a Ribbon Cutting ceremony on Saturday, October 20th for the Veterans Tribute Park. It lies between Pitman Hill Rd. and Kisker Rd. and is entirely within the city limits of Weldon Spring. Vehicles ac access the park can from Kisker Rd. but there is a footbridge for pedestrian access on the Pitman Hill Rd. side. There was a large turnout for the ceremony with area residents and local dignitaries in attendance.

"Veterans Tribute Park is unique in many ways," said County Executive Steve Ehlmann "It is the only County park of its kind surrounded by residential development in a suburban setting, and there are numerous amenities to enjoy – there is something for everyone. This park will be a destination for families in St. Charles County and throughout the region."

Some of the highlighted features of the park include:

- A destination playground for children of all abilities
- A paved walking and biking trail system -a 1.6-mile trail on the perimeter with smaller internal trails
- Two lakes stocked for catch-and-release fishing
- An off-leash dog park divided into small and large dog areas
- A veterans' memorial plaza in development that is scheduled to open in 2019

Independence Road Phase IV Update

The Final Plans, Specifications and Bid Documents for Independence Rd. Phase IV has been completed and approved by MoDOT, and the project scope is from the City Park (east end of the project) to Galahad Dr. (west end of the project). The City has selected Cochran Engineering to provide construction engineering, inspection, and testing services for this project. General contractor bids for the construction have been solicited and opened by the City and the apparent low/qualified bidder is Karrenbrock Construction out of New Melle, Missouri. The low bid from Karrenbrock was \$1,856,856.17 which includes some upgraded building material alternates. This project has funding from the federal STP roadway program, St. Charles County Road Board and the City of Weldon Spring.

The City intends to select and provide a notice to proceed to the successful bidder in November of 2018 and from that date the contractor will have 12 months to complete the project. The tentative completion date will be in November of 2019. Traffic will be reduced to one direction of travel for the duration of major work and will follow the same direction of travel (westbound) as Ind. Rd. Phase III had. Drivers are encouraged to seek alternative routes to avoid the construction zone and alleviate congestion in this fourth and final phase of the Independence

Road Improvement Projects.

A (not so) Rare Bird Sighted in Weldon Spring Park

A male Pileated Woodpecker has been spotted in the tall trees in Weldon Spring Park. The distinctive call and loud drumming draws attention to the vicinity of the trees beside the Red Barn; then, as it flies off one tree to another, the crowsized bird is easily spotted by its large band of white plumage across the wide black wings and topped off by a large red crest on the bird's head.

The Pileated Woodpecker is not necessarily "rare" in this part of the country but isn't commonly seen in most urban areas. They can be found in suburban areas with large trees and patches of woodland, much like we have here in Weldon Spring

Male Pileateds have a distinctive red "mustache" or stripe of red feathers on its cheek, which the female does not. Both sexes have the showy red crest or topknot of feathers that distinguish it from the smaller, more common Redheaded woodpecker, which has no crest (think of a cardinal's crested

head) but the Redheaded woodpecker's entire head is a blaze of red.

Look for these large, loud and beautiful birds in our City Park, or anywhere there are old growth hardwood trees. Occasionally, these large birds will visit backyard feeders if suet is offered.

Legend has it that Walter Lanz was inspired to create his most famous cartoon character when a Pileated woodpecker interrupted Mr. and Mrs. Lanz on their honeymoon in a cabin...the laughing call and red-crested intruder became Woody Woodpecker.

Winter Storm Water Update:

Clean Water is Essential for a Clean Environment

Fall is here, and Winter will soon be upon us. Please be aware of some seasonal things you can do to help improve the water quality within our City waterways:

- 1. Dispose of gathered leaves, pet waste, chemicals, paints, and other solid debris responsibly with your waste collector.
- 2. If needed, use fertilizers and pesticides only per the manufacturer's recommendations.
- 3. Use deicing chemicals and salt sparingly and only when needed. Remember rock salt damages concrete and is bad for the drainage channels.
- 4. Do some fall plantings of trees, shrubs or ornamentals to increase the green space on your property. Seasonal tree trimming and proper disposal of the branches should be done in the fall or winter dormant season. Stabilize any bare area in your yard with straw or other like materials.
- 5. If you have a septic tank and have not checked it recently, you should check it before winter, when service and access may be a problem.

Making a few changes in our lives can significantly reduce the number of pollutants we contribute to stormwater runoff. Be sure to check out our City of Weldon Spring website for City Newsletter back issues online, and more tips and information on improving stormwater quality. As always, if you see any suspicious dumping of any liquids or debris into the storm sewers, drainage ways or waterways within the City of Weldon Spring, please report/contact the City.

Something new this year for the Annual Food Drive


