20-07 - Establishing Pandemic Paid Sick Leave for City employees. Passed 3/26/20.

20-08 - Ehlmann Farms Street Dedication Acceptance: In the agreement, the developer must fulfill their obligations before the City accepts. Passed 4/14/20.

20-09 - Private Infrastructure Dedication Standard Operating Procedures. Passed 4/23/20.

20-10 - Updates the Purchasing Policy for the City of Weldon Spring. Passed 6/9/2020.

20-11 - FY 2020 Budget Amendment: Due to Covid-19, this Ordinance was necessary to amend the budget midyear for the Fiscal Year 2020 Budget available online. Passed 6/25/2020.

20-12 - Employee Policy Manual Amendments: Provided various revisions to the Employee Policy Manual related to fringe benefits and paid-time-off. Passed 6/25/20.

20-13 - False Alarms Ordinance. Passed 6/25/20.

20-14 - Ehlmann Farms Addition Final Plan. Passed 6/25/20.

20-15 - Right-of-Way Dedication from Fischer & Frichtel (Ehlmann Farms Addition) on Sammelmann Rd. Passed 6/25/20.

20-16 - Adopting Aquatic & Recreational Facilities Code: Created Chapter 260 establishing regulations for aquatic & recreational facilities (i.e., public pools, fitness centers, and tanning salons). Passed 7/14/20

20-17 – Aquatic & Recreational Agreement with St. Charles County: Facilities such as public pools, tanning salons, and fitness centers will be inspected and licensed through the County Health Department annually. The county will do routine inspections and follow up inspections for cited violations and respond to any complaints. Passed 7/14/20

FALSE ALARM CALLS IN WELDON SPRING


Due to an increase in false alarm calls to emergency services, beginning August 1, 2020, the City of Weldon Spring will track false alarms calls within the city. Individuals will receive warning letters from the City for the first two offenses within a calendar year. On the third offense within the same calendar year, the property owner or business will be subject to a citation and fine.

CITY PARK PLAYGROUND EXPANSION COMING FALL 2020

The Parks & Recreation Advisory Committee chose a final design for the City Park Play-ground expansion. The Board of Aldermen approved the plan and funding. The City looks to have this project completed by early-Fall 2020.

New Features Include

- New Swings with Belt, ADA, and Parent + Child Swing Seats
- Additional low play features for younger children
- New Parkour Pole Course
- Larger Play Space that creates unified area.
- A spinning play structure
- Updated woodchip surfacing and borders

WOLFRUM ROAD CULVERT PIPE

REPAIR PROJECT (written 07/17/2020)



The City has awarded an independent contract to repair a drainage culvert pipe on Wolfrum Road. Repair work started on 07/16/2020. This project was granted outside of Saint Charles County's maintenance program to expedite the repair and ensure public safety. Residents should note through the duration of this project the following: Wolfrum Road will be closed to all but local traffic between Independence Road and Patriotic Trail. Wolfrum Road is completely closed near Cedar Junction Lane to all through traffic. Drivers must use Patriotic Trail and Independence Road as detours to avoid the closure. All portions of the road will open after the necessary repairs are completed; completion and reopening is anticipated, pending weather, by August 1. 
CITY 2019 AUDITED FINANCIAL STATMENTS AND SIX MONTH REPORT AVAILABLE ONLINE

The City of Weldon Spring had an independent audit condected for the fiscal year that ended September 30, 2019. Residents are encouraged to read the information presented there along with the City's financial statements, including any notes.

FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

- -On a government-wide basis the assets of the City exceeded its liabilities for the most recent fiscal year by \$ 23,297,460. The City has unrestricted net position of \$ 3,336,226.
- -As of the close of the current fiscal year, the City's governmental funds reported combined ending fund balance of \$ 3,754,076.
- -At the end of the current fiscal year, unrestricted fund balance for the General Fund was \$ 1,263,542.
