RECENTL ORDINANCES

Below is a list of related ordinances that the Board of Aldermen passed since the last Newsletter.

20-24 - An Ordinance Adopting and Enacting the 2020 Code Adoption: This Ordinance authorizes General Codes to complete a supplement to our City Codes to include the most recent Ordinances passed by the City of Weldon Spring and reflect the recent changes to State Statute that affects those codes. Passed on December 8, 2020

20-25 - An Ordinance Executing an Agreement with St. Charles County for Police Services: This Ordinance is a 3-year agreement with St. Charles County for police services, which expires on December 31, 2023. Passed on December 8, 2020.

21-01 - An Ordinance Executing an Agreement with the Office of State Court Administration: This Ordinance authorized an additional \$7.00 surcharge to each court case, which will be turned over to the State to help finance the new mandated Show-Me Courts software. Passed on January 12, 2021.

21-02 – An Ordinance Executing an Intergovernmental Agreement with the City of St. Peters Regarding the Sammelman Road Improvement Project: This Ordinance is an agreement with St. Peters to provide construction management for improvements to the 90-degree curve on Sammelman Road. Passed on January 28, 2021.




STORMWATER MANAGEMENT PLAN & MS4

This year the City of Weldon Spring and all other Missouri municipalities are replying for their MS4 Permits from the Missouri Department of Natural Resources. The City would like to reintroduce its Stormwater Management Plan and explain why it is important.

What are the MS4 Permit and the Stormwater Management Plan? Why are they important?

MS4 stands for Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System. The City of Weldon Spring has a stormwater system used for properly collecting & conveying water; therefore, it must have a Storm Water Plan and an MS4 Permit issued by the Missouri Department of Natural Resources. The





There are six parts of the Weldon Spring Storm Water Plan:

- 1. Public Education & Outreach on Storm Water Impacts: This section of the newsletter, Stormwater Booths at City events, and the Weldon Spring Jr. Naturalist Scavenger Hunt are examples of the City's education efforts.
- 2. Public Involvement & Participation: The City is working to offer opportunities to volunteer and actively participate in stormwater management. Look for Tree plantings, stream cleans, and more on the City's social media.
- 3. Illicit Discharge Detection & Elimination: Catch problems early and stop them at the source.
- 4. Construction Site Stormwater Runoff Control: Review of plans and construction requirements like silt fencing
- 5. Post Construction Stormwater Management in New Development







- & Redevelopment: Reviewing the continued maintenance of stormwater facilities.
- 6. **Pollution Prevention**: On-going efforts to reduce pollution in the City's stormwater system.

How can residents help?

The best way to help is through being informed and actively engaged in and around your own home. Develop good habits that improve and don't hurt the environment. Look to this regular newsletter for seasonal tips on how to help and volunteer for events like stream team clean-ups and more.

WELDON SPRING CITY PARK PROJECTS

Regular Visitors to Weldon Spring City Park may have noticed some changes to the grounds' landscape. Construction on the expanded trail system began in January. The contractor has removed the white vinyl fence along Nancy Lane, drained an unsightly pond, and began site preparations. This project will almost double the ADA-compliant paved walking trails and provide access to the amenities on the east side of the City Park.

Following the City Park Master Plan 2017, the Parks & Recreation Advisory Committee (PRAC) has identified the next projects for Weldon Spring City



Park. The PRAC is planning to build a new large pavilion with ADA Restrooms, and an amphitheater. Both facilities are

in the early planning stages and will become more refined over time.



The amphitheater will serve as a centerpiece of the park for future events like movie nights, live music, and theater productions. The amphitheater will be located near the lake. The large pavilion, capable of hosting 120 guests and ADA restrooms are planned for the eastern portion of the park. The city hopes this space can be used for events like city BBQs, and fitness classes. The public will be able to rent the facilities for family reunions, wedding receptions, and much more. The PRAC has drawn inspiration from surrounding parks for the design of the structures.

New security features in City Park

The City has installed new security features in City Park to better protect visitors. LED parking-lot lights replaced the old halogen ones. These new lights will only be used in the evenings when there are meetings or events. Security cameras on the outside of city hall have also been upgraded and now provide higher quality videos and night vision. However, it is always important to put personal safety first by knowing surroundings, locking your vehicle, and leaving valuables at home. City Park is closed from dusk to dawn.

In October of 2020, the City of Weldon Spring transitioned to a new website. The website has many new tools to help the public stay connected and interact with the City.



TIPS FOR USING THE WEBSITE

The City of Weldon Spring's new website has many features that will assist the public in finding important information. However, the website has the most visited pages listed on the home page for easier access. The Blue Box in the middle right of the home page has direct links to Applications & Forms, the Municipal Code, Meetings & Agendas, and Report-a-Concern. All one needs to do is click. Additionally, visitors can search the entire website using the search bar near the top right of the home screen.

E-NOTIFICATIONS

The Email Notifications System is totally new and will allow for more consistent messaging from the City. If you had signed up for email notifications before the website transition, you would need to sign up again.

The public can also sign up for Emergency Text Notifications through the website. This tool will only be used in situations that affect your safety or health like tornado warnings, water boil orders, and similar items.


MAKE BALL FIELD & PAVILION RESERVATIONS ONLINE

SAMMELMAN ROAD IMPROVEMENT 2021

The City will move forward with a project to improve Sammelman Rd. at the 90-degree turn between the Manors of Lucerne and the new Ehlmann Farms subdivisions headed toward Pitman Hill Rd. This project will ease the turn's sharpness, improve visibility, and make the area safer for vehicles and pedestrians. This project is expected to cost approximately \$133,000. This project's full completion will be by September 1st, 2021 at the latest. For more information please visit weldonspring.org.






WOLFRUM ROAD CULVERT PIPE REPLACEMENT 2021

On Monday, March 1, 2021, Wolfrum Road was closed between Independence Road and Patriotic Trail. The City identified the need for emergency repairs to a drainage culvert pipe that runs the width of Wolfrum Rd at that location. COMMUNITY-WIDE SURVEY COMING SOON



The City has hired ETC Institute to perform a community-wide survey of residents & businesses. This survey will aid City Staff & Elected Officials in setting priorities for the future of Weldon Spring. If you receive a survey in the mail, please follow all directions listed on the document and return it in a timely manner.

PARKS & TRAILS MASTER PLANNING

The City will seek qualifications from professional planning firms to assist and facilitate the development of the first city-wide Park Master Plan and review and update the City's current Trail Plan found in the Comprehensive Plan. These planning initiatives will engage the community with the goal of identifying the types, areas and, funding needs for future park, trail, and recreation improvements.

FACILITY NEEDS ASSESSMENT

In another planning initiative, the City will seek qualifications with firms specializing in evaluating the condition of municipal facilities and identifying the needs of the organization and community from a functional building layout/design standpoint. As most residents know City Hall has been housed in a retrofitted ranch-style residence since 1999 situated in the primary City Park located in the heart of the City. Before this, the City rented space in the "Old Town" area near the Mercedes Benz dealership, and at one point the City met in the basement of one of the local churches. The City plans to utilize the data and analysis generated from this initiative to formulate plans for facility improvements in the future.


