

Following recent heavy rains, a landslide forced the closure of a section of Wolfrum Road, beginning at Patriotic Trail and extending one-tenth of a mile northeast. For the safety of our residents and visitors, I've authorized an emergency contract with Cochran Engineering to expedite repairs and develop a solution. Please avoid the area and use alternative routes as we work to restore safe access.

Golf carts have become more common on our streets please read our Golf Cart Rules on page two. These guidelines are in place to ensure the safety of everyone in our community.

Thank you for your continued dedication to making Weldon Spring a vibrant, welcoming, and safe community. As always, it is an honor to serve as your mayor.

GOLF CARTS IN THE CITY
[Ord. No. 19-13, 8-22-2019; Ord. No. 24-04, 3-28-2024]

Requirements For Operating Golf Carts On Streets, Roads, Or Pathways Within The City.

- 1. Any individual operating a golf cart shall have a valid operator's or chauffeur's license.
- 2. Any individual operating a golf cart shall adhere to all traffic signs and/or signals, and when crossing subdivision streets, the golf cart operator shall yield to all cross-traffic, on-coming vehicles, and/or pedestrians.
- 3. The golf cart shall be properly insured or have other coverage, and such proof of insurance shall specifically list the vehicle as referenced by the serial number and year of the model.
- 4. The golf cart shall be operated at a speed not exceeding twenty (20) miles per hour pursuant to Section 304.034, RSMo.

## No individual operating a golf cart shall:

- 1. Operate the golf cart in any careless or imprudent manner so as to endanger any person or property of any
- 2. Operate the golf cart while under the influence of alcohol or controlled substances.
- 3. Carry more passengers than the golf cart is specifically designed to carry.
- 4. Operate the golf cart between the hours of official sunset and sunrise unless the golf cart is properly equipped with headlights and taillights.
- 5. Operate the golf cart on any Federal, State or County highways, except to cross.
- 6. Cross any Federal or State highway at an intersection where the highway being crossed has a posted speed limit of more than forty-five (45) miles per hour pursuant to Section 304.034, RSMo.
- 7. Operate a golf cart on a sidewalk or pathway less than seven (7) feet wide.
- 8. Be hanging on or standing up, and all passengers must be seated while the golf cart moves.

A violation of this Section shall be an ordinance violation, subject to penalties stated in Section 100.220(A).

## PRIVATE FIREWORKS MAY ONLY BE DISCHARGED FROM 12:00 PM ON 07/02 THROUGH 11:00 PM ON 07/06

The discharge of fireworks within the City limits shall be limited to the second day of July through the sixth day of July of the same year, between the hours of 12:00 Noon and 11:00 P.M. only, unless authorized by City permit. Persons fifteen (15) years of age and younger shall not discharge fireworks except under the supervision of an adult. Supervision shall be adequate where the adult is within sight and sound of the minor during the discharge of the fireworks.


## NEW & IMPROVED PLAYGROUND COMING SOON!

The City of Weldon Spring is excited to announce changes coming to City Park Playground. The new structure will offer better accessibility and imaginative play for all kids. The Parks and Recreation Advisory Committee (PRAC) reviewed designs from three vendors. The PRAC recommended the design from Byrne & Jones for \$300,000 and an additional \$17,425 to top off the Engineered Wood Fiber mulch across the entire playground area. The Board of Aldermen approved the design and purchase. Byrne &



Jones will begin construction in mid-July. The current plan will only close the immediate area where the construction will occur, leaving the rest of the playground playable. ## WELCOME MARGARET CULVER, WARD THREE'S NEW ALDERMAN

In the April Municipal Election residents of Ward Three elected Margaret Culver (MC) to be their alderman. To give an introduction of sorts for the new alderman to the City, we asked a few questions about who she is and what she wants to do for the the community.



1. How long have you lived in Weldon Spring?

Alderman - Since 1982, before Weldon Spring became the City of Weldon Spring in 1984.

2. Have you served in public office before? Alderman-Yes, I have served as Chairman of the Board of Trustees, Alderman and Mayor of the City. I also volunteered in the planning for the concept Weldon Spring and served on several committees and/or boards.

3. The City's vision statement is "The City of Weldon Spring fosters a premier Community that is a safe place to live and enjoy life." Our Mission Statement is "The City of Weldon Spring will provide premier public services to the Community with integrity, transparency, and fiscal responsibility." As an Alderman, how will you help the city achieve its vision and mission?

Alderman- When I first became involved there were 509 residents according to the sign on the highway. I will continue to do now what I did then. Listen to constituents, address their concerns, and be transparent about our work.

## WOLFRUM ROAD LANDSLIDE

The City of Weldon Spring has announced an extended closure of Wolfrum Road following a significant landslide washout due to heavy rainfall. The landslide rendered the road unsafe

for travel, prompting city officials to respond immediately to ensure public safety.

Mayor Donald Licklider has authorized an emergency contract with Cochran Engineering to develop comprehensive repair plans for the affected area. This decision expedites the evaluation and restoration process, allowing the city to act swiftly in addressing the damage caused by the landslide.

"Public safety is our top priority," said Mayor Licklider. "We are taking immediate steps to assess and repair Wolfrum Road to ensure it is safe for our residents and visitors. Our partnership with Cochran Engineering will help us formulate a clear plan for restoration."

The closure begins at Patriotic Trail and continues one-tenth of a mile northeast on Wolfrum Road. All traffic must avoid the area and use alternative routes until the repairs are complete. The city will provide updates as more information becomes available and a timeline for reopening the road is established.

City officials are collaborating with Cochran Engineering to evaluate the extent of the damage and develop a plan that reduces disruption while ensuring a comprehensive and safe repair process.

## STORMWATER MANAGEMENT

When land in Weldon Spring is developed, stormwater systems are often installed to control the runoff. The maintenance of Best Management Practices (BMPs) for stormwater management typically falls under the responsibility of the property owner or homeowner's association (HOA). These BMPs are designed to prevent and reduce stormwater runoff pollution, protecting water quality.

## Routine Maintenance tasks:

• Mowing grass, removing trash and debris, and ensuring outlet pipes remain clear of blockages.

## Non-Routine Maintenance:

- Sediment removal, slope repair, and erosion control measures.
- •BMPs require annual inspections to ensure their effectiveness and structural integrity. The HOA or property owner of each BMP should inspect their facilities annually and perform any needed maintenance. All property owners are required to maintain their improvements according to the approved site plans.
- Newer construction in the City requires annual reports to be filed by the property owner. Please call the City Community Development Office for more information.
