

CITY OF WELDON SPRING REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN SEPTEMBER 26, 2024

CALL TO ORDER: The Weldon Spring Board of Aldermen met for their regular meeting at Weldon Spring City Hall, 5401 Independence Road on Thursday, September 26, 2024, at 7:30 PM with Mayor Donald Licklider presiding.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE: Mayor Licklider asked everyone in attendance to stand and join in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

ROLL CALL AND DETERMINATION OF QUORUM: On a roll call, the following Aldermen were present:

A quorum was declared.

Also, present were Mayor Licklider, Don Stolberg (City Administrator), and Bill Hanks (City Clerk).

PUBLIC COMMENTS:

• Lisa Baker, 124 Osage Way: She recently become aware of the actions, by the City, at the September 12, 2024, Board of Alderman meeting. After she viewed the minutes from that meeting, she became very disappointed on how the reconsideration vote for the rezoning request at 6101 Ozark Way transpired because there was no mention of the reconsideration vote on the agenda. She asked the Board what condition existed to prompt a reconsideration vote on something that was already denied by the City.

MINUTES:

September 12, 2024 – Regular Board Meeting Minutes: Alderman Yeager moved to approve the minutes from the September 12, 2024, regular meeting, as submitted. The motion was seconded by Alderman Martiszus. Motion carried with 4 ayes. Alderman Clutter abstained from voting.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

Alderman Yeager made a motion to accept the Treasurer's packet of paid bills from September 6, 2024, to September 19, 2024. The motion was seconded by Alderman Martiszus. **Motion carried** with 5 ayes.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Bill #1230 – An Ordinance Adopting the Budget for Fiscal Year 2025 for the City of Weldon Spring, Missouri, and Matters Relating Thereto: Alderman Clutter made a motion to approve Bill #1230 for its second and final reading by title only. Alderman Yeager seconded the motion.

On a roll call vote, the Bill #1230 was placed as Ordinance 24-17 as followed:

Bill #1232 - An Ordinance Amending Section 100.37- of the City of Weldon Spring's Employee Policy Manual Regarding Holidays & Matter Relating Thereto:

Alderman Yeager made a motion to approve Bill #1232 for its second and final reading by title only. Alderman Martiszus seconded the motion.

On a roll call vote, the Bill #1232 was placed as Ordinance 24-18 as followed:

NEW BUSINESS:

828 Nancy Lane Escrow Release: Alderman Yeager made a motion to release \$5,000.00 from escrow because the house was never constructed and Graystone Home, LLC, no longer have ownership of the lot associated with 828 Nancy Lane. The motion was seconded by Alderman Kolb. Motion carried with 5 ayes.

400 Siedentop Road Escrow Release – New Perspective of Weldon Spring: Alderman Yeager made a motion to release \$10,000.00 from escrow to Boldt Capital because the City conducted final inspection to ensure compliance with all the requirements by the City. The motion was seconded by Alderman Kolb. Motion carried with 5 ayes.

REPORTS AND COMMITTEES:

Architectural Review Commission (ARC): Alderman Clutter stated that ARC plans to

submit their suggested codes changes to the Planning & Zoning Commission for their review in the next 3 months.

Parks & Recreation Advisory Committee (PRAC) Report: There was a brief discussion about upcoming City's events and the replacement of playground equipment at Weldon Spring City Park in Fiscal Year 2025.

City Administrator Report: The City Administrator Report was submitted to the Board prior to the meeting.

There was a brief discussion about the timing with the completion of Westwood Sidewalk Extension project and the Pedestrian Crossing Improvement project.

Alderman Clutter requested that the Board schedule a Work Session to discuss a direction for the future of City Hall before the next Board meeting.

RECEIPTS & COMMUNICATIONS:

Alderman Kolb stated that she is extremely disappointed in the decision from the members of the Board that reversed the denial of ½ acre zoning on the 9.5 acres tract off Ozark Way. She reminded the Board that a remonstrance was filed with notarized signatures of 86% of the surrounding properties owners opposing ½ acre zoning. She believes that the City acted in an improper manner in calling of a reconsideration vote because there was no notification on the agenda that this was being brought up at the September 12, 2024, Board meeting.

Alderman Baker made a motion to authorize the City to spend \$129.500 for electrical and plumbing repairs to City Hall. The **motion failed** because there was a lack of a second to the motion to call for a vote.

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE PROCEDURE, REQUIREMENTS AND TIME PERIOD FOR FILING AS A CANDIDATE FOR THE OFFICES OF MAYOR & ALDERMAN FOR THE CITY OF WELDON SPRING, MISSOURI IN THE APRIL 8th, 2025, MUNICIPAL ELECTION

WHEREAS, a general municipal election is to be held in the City of Weldon Spring, Missouri, on Tuesday, April 8th, 2025; and

WHEREAS, at this election, the offices to be filled are Mayor and one (1) Alderman for each of the City's three (3) wards.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF WELDON SPRING, MISSOURI IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE REVISED STATUTES OF MISSOURI AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: There will be one (1) Mayor and three (3) Aldermen, one (1) from each ward elected at the municipal election to be held on Tuesday, April 8th, 2025. The Mayoral candidate receiving the highest number of votes shall hold his or her office for a period of two (2) years. Also, the Aldermanic candidate receiving the highest number of votes in each ward shall hold his or her office for a period of two (2) years.

SECTION 2: Procedure for filing as a candidate for Mayor or Alderman is as follows:

- A. Filing as a candidate for the office of Mayor or Alderman must be made in person, or in writing as provided in Section 115.355, RSMo. to the City Clerk, William C. Hanks, at 5401 Independence Road, Weldon Spring, Missouri 63304, Monday through Friday between the hours of 9:00 A.M. and 4:00 P.M.
- B. Such filing shall open at 8:00 A.M. on Tuesday, December 10, 2024, and close at 5:00 P.M. on Tuesday, December 31, 2024.

SECTION 3: Any person who is not qualified for office as provided by state law or City Ordinances shall not be entitled to have his/her name printed on the ballot. No person shall be elected or appointed and sworn into office who is not qualified for such office as provided by state law or City Ordinances.

SECTION 4: The general municipal election of April 8th, 2025 shall be conducted as described and set forth in Section 115.001, RSMo.

SECTION 5: The City Clerk is hereby directed to cause public notice to be given of the general municipal election in accordance with the requirements of Section 115.127, RSMo. The notice of the opening and closing of filing to be published shall be as set forth in Exhibit A, attached hereto and made a part hereof.

SECTION 6: The City Clerk shall notify the St. Charles County Director of Elections, as the designated election authority, in writing, that the City is calling the general municipal election, specifying the purpose of the election, and the date of the election, the legal notice to be published and the sample ballot. The Director of Elections shall conduct in the City the general municipal election in accordance with State laws.

<u>SECTION 7</u>: The City Clerk shall keep a permanent record of the names of the candidates, the offices for which they seek election, and the date of their filing, and the names shall appear on the ballots in that order.

SECTION 8: The vote of the aforesaid being deemed an emergency by the Board of Alderman, the Board does hereby waive and dispense with the tabling procedure set forth in City Code, Section 110.070 (A)(3) and does hereby authorize the reading of the above bill twice at the meeting, and a vote there to immediately following said reading.

SECTION 9: This Ordinance shall be in full force and take effect from and after its final passage and approval.

The original plan for the Pedestrian Crossings Project included crosswalk improvements at the crosswalk on Weldon Spring Parkway at the Pocket Park as well as five other locations. These were drawn up and presented to the Board of Aldermen and the crosswalk at the Pocket Park was removed from the project by majority vote of the Board of Aldermen.

Between the time that the project was designed and approved (with the removal of the pocket park portion) by the Aldermen, the engineering firm overseeing the project has had at least two changes of primary engineer on the project, which appears to have resulted in the incorrect version of the plan being brought forth and bid upon. This version included the pocket park portion and the Construction company selected (Vision Construction) has already ordered the materials and signage for the crosswalk.

There are two options available at this time:

- 1. We can allow Vision Construction to continue with the plan that includes the pocket park, to include signage and crossing signals; or
- 2. We can ask them to exclude the pocket park crosswalk, which will require the City to pay for any return fees, restocking of materials, and construction time and effort already spent. I am checking to see how much that would be, but it is my understanding that the signage and signals have already been ordered. Once I have definitive costs, I will share this with you.

Change order request to Westwood Sidewalk Extension Project

Recently, a resident contacted the city and provided a detailed report of numerous trip hazards along the sidewalks on Weldon Spring parkway. Since we had a contractor (Infrastructure Management) already working on a sidewalk project in the city, we reached out to them to see how much the repairs would cost and if they would be willing to do them. During inspection of the sidewalks, two other areas needing immediate repair were also identified. The median curb nose on O'Fallon Rd. at Weldon Spring Parkway had recently been broken and needed repair, as well as a stormwater inlet and manhole near the CSI building was undermined, threatening the stability of the street at that location.

There are 30 locations of sidewalks along Weldon Spring Parkway that are serious trip hazards, ranging from 1 inch to as much as 6 inches. The repair for these includes removal and replacement of the defective slabs. The cost proposed is \$32,131.23. The repair of the median nose on O'Fallon Rd. is proposed at \$790. The repair of the concrete pavement at the manhole, where it is undermined and becoming a sinkhole in front of CSI is proposed at \$5,815. The total amount to be added to the contract by this change order would be \$38,736.23.

The City Engineer has inspected the areas and reviewed the proposal and finds that the proposal is very reasonable, and likely will save the city money in the long run if we wait and contract out the repairs separately.

This is cheaper than going out to bid with another contractor. They will have the work completed this fall – going out bid would also add cost to develop a contract, delay to get work completed. Infrastructure Management appears to be knowledgeable about the work and ADA requirements – which many concrete contractors lack unless they do public works projects. A small contract would also attract limited bidders. Here we have a ready, willing and able contractor and inspection lined out with Cochran.




